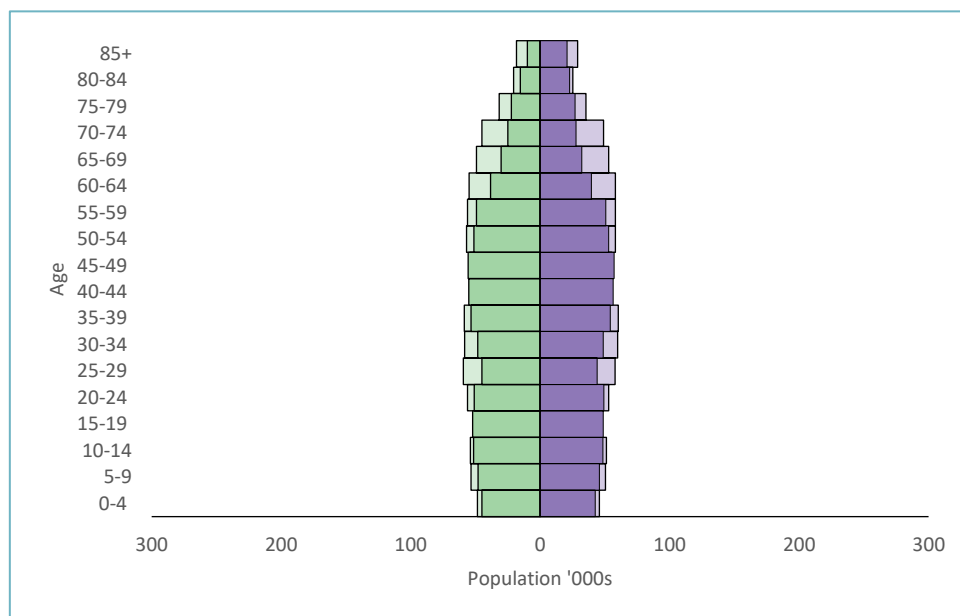
SOUTH AUSTRALIA POPULATION

South Australia (SA) was established in 1836 as a freely settled British colony and developed a reputation for social reform and innovation. Its capital, Adelaide, is known for its elegant city design and renowned wine regions, while the state's landscapes range from fertile valleys and coastlines to the vast deserts of the interior.

- In SA, the average number of children a woman will bear is around 1.46 babies per woman.
- Life expectancy in SA is at 80.9 for men, and 85 for women.
- Over the last year, SA gained 18,748 residents via net overseas migration, and lost 1,470 residents via net interstate migration.

In 2025, an estimated 1,898,600 people resided in SA
