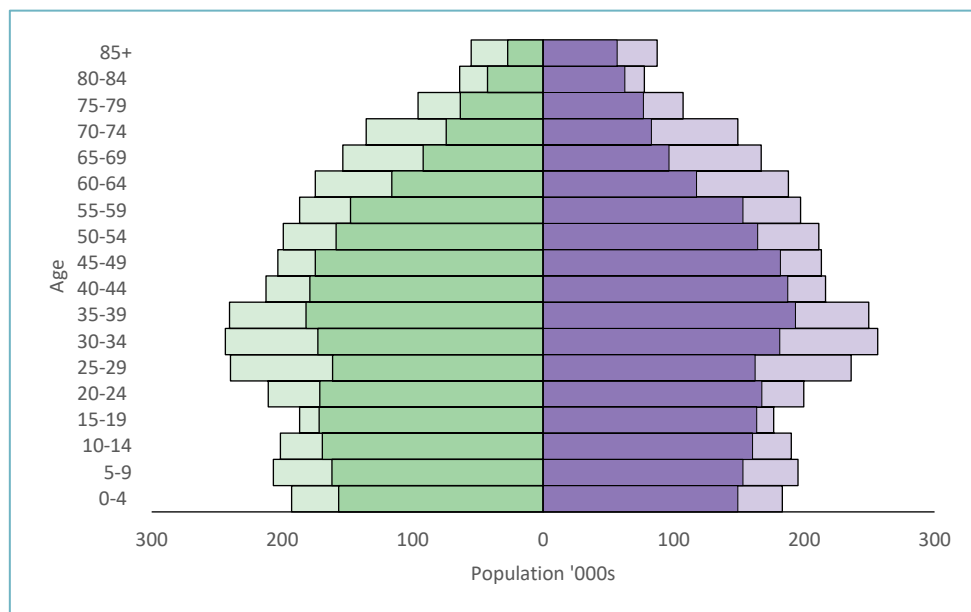
VICTORIA POPULATION

Victoria (VIC) is Australia's smallest mainland state but one of its most densely populated, with Melbourne as its capital and cultural heart. Established in 1851, Victoria is known for its dynamic arts and food scene, historic architecture, and diverse landscapes ranging from coastal beaches to alpine regions.

- In VIC, the average number of children a woman will bear is around 1.52 babies per woman.
- Life expectancy in VIC is at 81.5 for men, and 85.4 for women.
- Over the last year, VIC gained 93,176 residents via net overseas migration, and lost 2,318 residents via net interstate migration.

In 2025, an estimated 7,053,100 people resided in VIC
